Free School Meals

Important: Changes to Free School Meal Protection

The Government recognises the benefits of providing a healthy school meal to the most disadvantaged pupils.

Since 1 April 2018, all pupils with existing and new free school meal eligibility have continued to receive free school meals whilst Universal Credit was rolled out. This applied even if the claimant's earnings rose above the threshold after entitlement was awarded due to the free school meal protection policy.

The free school meal protection policy will end on 31 March 2025.

On 31 March 2025, all pupils with existing free school meal eligibility will continue to receive free school meals until the end of their primary school phase of education, regardless of whether the claimant meets the eligibility criteria.

From 1 April 2025, any pupil gaining a new free school meal eligibility will not be protected by the free school meal protection policy. This means their eligibility will end whenever the claimant's earnings rise above the threshold, or they are no longer a recipient of Universal Credit.

We want to make sure as many eligible pupils as possible receive their free school meal eligibility before 31 March 2025 so that their entitlement remains protected.

It's really easy to check whether or not your child is entitled to free school meals. Just click on the link below and complete a very quick application. You should get the results on the same day that you submit the application. Alternatively, if you do not have internet access, you can collect a paper application from the school office.

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO PENALTY NOTICE CHARGES

The DfE announced during the summer term national charges to penalty notices issues for unauthorised absences in term time, these came into into effect on the 19th August 2024.

- Penalty notices issued for the offence after the 19th of August 2024 will be charged at the new rate of ± 160.00 however if paid in 21-days this reduces to ± 80.00 .
- Any second penalty notice to the same parent for the same child in a rolling 3year period will be issued at the rate of £160.00 to be paid within 28-days with no option for a discount.
- Penalty notice threshold is 10-sessions equivalent to 5-days of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10-school week period.
- Maximum of 2-penalty notices may be issued for the same child within a rolling 3-years period, so at the 3rd or subsequent offence another course of action will need to be considered such a prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions.

Dear Parent/Carer

The measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine is one of the most studied vaccines and millions of doses are given every year.

As your child starts school, we recommend that they have had two doses of the MMR vaccine to ensure they are fully protected, as the complications of measles can be severe and life changing. You will also be protecting them against mumps and rubella, which can also be serious illnesses.

Measles cases are rising in the North West so it is important that you check your child's red book to see if they have had their pre-school booster vaccine and two doses of MMR. If not, contact your GP surgery to make an appointment.

Please scan the QR code below for further information on the MMR vaccine.

This year your child will also be eligible for a free nasal flu vaccine, and this will be offered to them at their school during the autumn term.


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


